### OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (LONG WITTENHAM PARISH) (SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 2021

Oxfordshire County Council, in exercise of its powers under sections 82(2) & 83(2) & 84 and Part IV of Section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to that Act hereby make the following Order.

- This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Long Wittenham Parish) (Speed Limits) Order 2021 and shall come into force on the tenth day of December 2021.
- 2. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- 3. The roads specified in Schedule 2 to this Order shall be restricted roads for the purposes of section 81 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 4. No person shall drive any vehicle at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- 6. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to a vehicle falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011, being a vehicle used for naval, military or air force purposes, when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- 7. The Oxfordshire County Council (Aston Rowant and Lewknor Area) (Speed Limits) Order 2011 is hereby revoked.

# SCHEDULE 1

# 20mph Speed Limit:

All roads within Long Wittenham leading out to the following points:

a)	Didcot Road	a point 90 metres south of its junction with Saxons Heath	
b)	Little Wittenham Road	With High Stroot	
c)	Long Wittenham Road	a point 115 metres north of its junction with Little Wittenham Road.	

## **SCHEDULE 2**

## 30mph Speed Limit:

a)	Long Wittenham Road	From a point 115 metres north of its junction with Little Wittenham Road, northwards	for 372 metres
b)	Sires Hill	From the junction of the unnamed roads to Long Wittenham, North Moreton and Brightwell-cum-Sotwell, south-westwards	for 193 metres.
